Construction & Real Estate Partner Charles Williams Receives the Prestigious Bridgett Medal From Franklin & Marshall College

Past recipients of the Bridgett Medal include clergy, physicians, lawyers, business executives, entrepreneurs and government officials.

Williams is a founding member of F&M's African American Alumni Council and a longtime supporter of the Black Student Union. Alumni selected for the Bridgett Medal come from diverse personal and professional backgrounds, exerting influence and providing support in a wide range of areas including research studies and publications, leadership development, education, academic achievement, community service and the arts.

A prominent Construction and Real Estate attorney, Williams focuses his practice on construction, real property and government relations issues and commercial litigation, including the representation of sureties. He has tried numerous cases in New York State courts and has frequently represented clients in actions in the federal courts in both New York and New Jersey.
